

The Vicar writes...

Candlemas describes a vital episode in the life of Jesus the Jew. The Presentation in the Temple simultaneously offers past and future perspectives, both affirming Jesus's heritage and presaging the suffering of the Messiah and his followers. The central role of Simeon and Anna also give Candlemas its particular charism in affirming the work of those who faithfully give of their time and talents week by week, to glorify God and maintain the beauty of holiness in church worship. As we hear the familiar words of the Nunc Dimittis in a less familiar context, are we sufficiently attuned to Malachi's prospect of the Lord coming suddenly to his temple?

(Based on the Gospel for Sunday: Luke 2.22-40.)
